These comments seem to all revolve around Urban water users as well as the options for resilient water supply, evaporation, population growth and other issues that the state may take into account to reduce the % reduction a district will have to obtain. What about the Small Districts (Under 3000 connections). Till now we've had two choices, to reduce our usage by 25% or go to a two day a week watering schedule. Being from a small town located in the North Eastern Sierras where we have been able to sustain our water supply though out the drought seems a bit skewed still having to restrict our customers. In my opinion, these small districts should be exempt from the state mandated restriction for the simple reason that the City of Sacramento uses more water in 1 day than my district does in a month without restrictions. Our per capita water use is also under the state average even without restrictions in mid-summer. It just does not seem right that our small town is drying up when we are sitting on a well sustained water source. Thank you
