The following information is provided in satisfaction of the public notice requirements of Section 3858, title 23, of the California Code of Regulations, which govern the State's Water Quality Certification Program.

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff are proposing to regulate this Project pursuant to section 401 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1341) and the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act. Staff will consider all comments submitted in writing and received at this office during a 21-day comment period that begins on the first full date of issuance of this notice (October 9, 2024) and ends at 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the comment period (October 29, 2024). Background: On September 3, 2024, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), District 12, and Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) jointly submitted an application for Clean Water Act section 401 water quality certification for the State Route 55 (SR-55) (Interstate 5 to State Route 91) Improvement Project (12-0K7201; Project).

Project Description: The primary goal of the proposed Project is to improve traffic operations and reduce congestion on SR-55 between Interstate 5 (I-5) and State Route 91 (SR-91) within the cities of Tustin, Santa Ana, Orange, and Anaheim in Orange County, California. The Project proposes to increase capacity on SR-55 between I-5 and State Route 22 (SR-22) and provide operational improvement between SR-22 and SR-91.

The Project would include the following operational improvements:

- An additional general-purpose lane in both directions between north of the I-5/SR-55 interchange to the SR-55/SR-22 interchange.
- Realignment of the median barrier between Fourth Street and 17th Street.
- An additional lane on the northbound (NB) Fourth Street off-ramp, southbound (SB) Fourth Street off-ramp, and SB Katella Avenue off- and on-ramps.
- Realignment of the SB SR-55 Lincoln Avenue off-ramp approximately 1,300 feet to the south, immediately north of the existing SB SR-55 Lincoln Avenue onramp.

Retaining walls are required at the following locations where the SR-55 mainline will be widened to accommodate the improvements:

- SB SR-55/I-5 Connector
- SB Fourth Street to 17th Street
- SB Between the SR-55 mainline and Lincoln Avenue hook off-ramp
- SB Lincoln Avenue hook off-ramp
- NB 17th Street on-ramp

The Project application reports impacts to waters of the state, including waters of the U.S., as shown in Table 1. Temporary impacts only (no permanent impacts) are proposed at the unvegetated, concrete-lined drainages.
