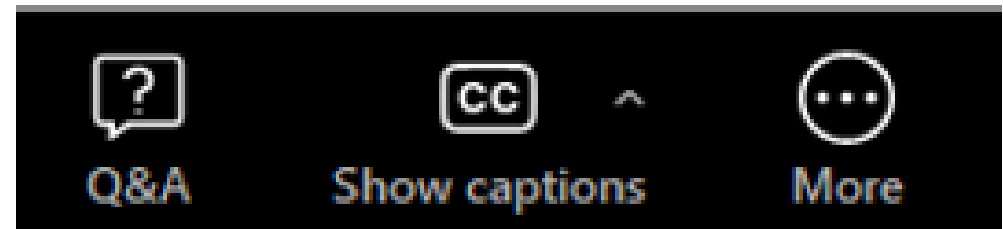

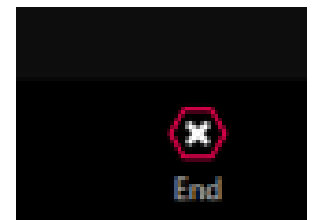

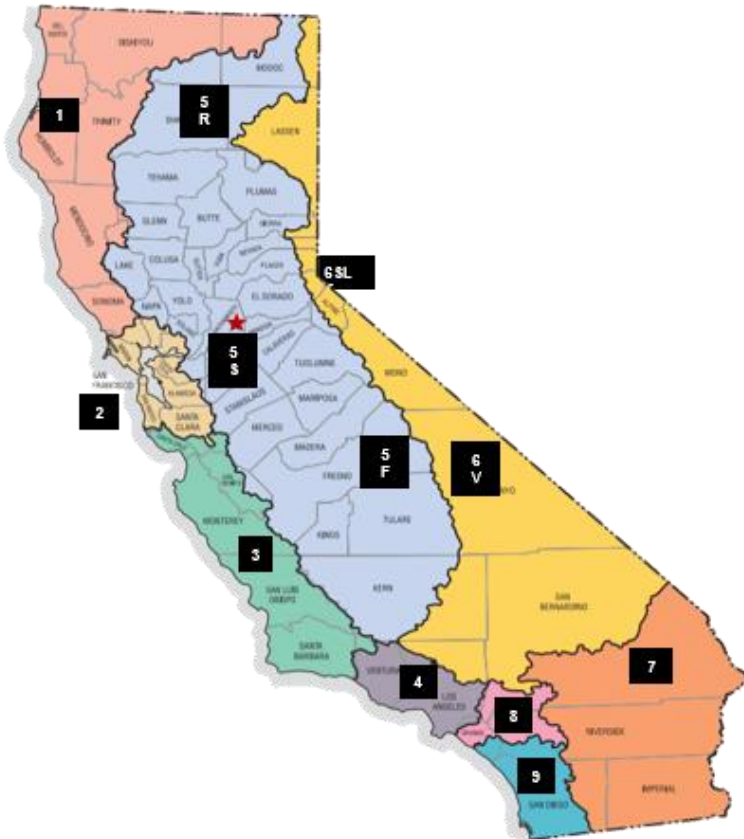

Don't I already have a permit?

- **Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) Program**
 - Issues/manages permits and waivers related to wastewater discharges to land to protect water quality
- **WDR Program is one of many programs within Water Boards**
 - Separate programs, each with own water quality concerns
 - Construction and Industrial Stormwater, Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program (ILRP), Recycled Water, etc.
 - Wineries need separate permits from applicable programs

Don't I already have a permit?

- **Winery Order is one permit of many within WDR Program**
 - Not a Winery Program or Winery Order Program
 - Winery Order adopted by State Board, implemented by regional boards
 - Statewide general order → same permit can be used by all regions for wineries throughout California
- **Winery Order coordination**
 - State Board provides information applicable statewide, answer general questions
 - Regional boards are a winery's direct contact, answer site-specific questions, review permit applications, oversee permit compliance

Where do I start?

1) Am I eligible? Do I need Winery Order coverage?

- Determine winery tier – calculate/project annual process water discharge
 - Discharge to land → pond, land application area, subsurface disposal area
- Do self-driven online Eligibility Survey if unsure

2) When do I apply?

Unpermitted existing winery? Apply Now

Have existing individual WDRs, waiver, regional general order coverage? Apply now or date determined by region-specific enrollment priority

Notified by regional board to apply or transfer from existing permit? See deadline in notice

New winery? Apply at least 180 days before begin operations

Where do I start?

3) What are some planning considerations?

- Assess and gather information for current winery/facility/site
- Any planned facility or process changes (material changes), time horizons?
- Compare Winery Order requirements for current vs. future site conditions
 - Use Compliance Calendar Tool

4) How do I apply?

- 3-part application: Notice of Intent (NOI), technical report, filing fee
 - Existing wineries (operate on/before 1/20/2021) submit proposed compliance schedule
- Help improve turnaround time
 - Submit a more complete application, answer data requests promptly
 - Helps regional board review application and determine complete, issue Notice of Applicability (NOA) to authorize winery discharge

Where do I start?

5) Where can I get help?

- State Board
 - Winery Order website – detailed info, resources and guides, contact info, links
 - Winery mailbox – email general Winery Order questions
- Regional boards
 - Individual mailboxes – email facility-specific or region-specific questions on Winery Order or region-specific procedures and requirements
- External support – other wineries, winery groups, industry groups, consultants, etc.
 - Exchange knowledge, expertise, approaches, etc.
 - May need professional certification/signatures for a few Winery Order requirements
 - Be informed – know your facility, capital and operational needs, applicable Winery Order requirements, etc.

How do I understand the Winery Order?

Winery Order has flexibility

- Covers multiple treatment and disposal options
- Contains requirement off-ramps, triggers that initiate requirements
- Extended timeframes (planning windows) for permit compliance
- Rare for a winery where all Winery Order requirements are applicable

Overarching requirement categories

- 1) **Tier** – exempt, Tiers 1, 2, 3, or 4
- 2) **Disposal method** – pond, land application, and/or subsurface disposal
- 3) **Facility type** – existing, new, or expanding facility
- 4) **Winery waste** – discharge process water and/or process solids
- 5) **Water quality** – can trigger monitoring, Salt or Nitrogen Control Plans, etc.



Requirement callouts

- Every requirement has a unique identifier.
- Consists of alternating numbers and letters.
- Sublevels are each indented inwards.

Winery tiers based on the volume of water generated and discharged (see Table 1). The tiers shall not exceed the requirements of the application for the application, and shall be commensurate with, the complexity of the discharge regulated under each tier.

Table 1. Tier Determination

Tier	Facility process water flow ⁽¹⁾ (gal/yr)
Exempt	<10,000
Tier 1	10,000 – 30,000
Tier 2	30,001 – 300,000
Tier 3	300,001 – 1,000,000
Tier 4	1,000,001 – 15,000,000

- Winery Order, pg 3, #12.a

12. Wineries with process water design flows less than 10,000 gallons per year (gal/yr) are unlikely to degrade water quality and are therefore exempt from this General Order provided they comply with the following:

- a. The Discharger shall not discharge waste:
 - i. To surface waters or surface water drainage courses.
 - ii. That is classified as "hazardous," as defined in California Code of Regulations (CCR), title 23, section 2521, or classified as "designated," as defined in Water Code section 13173.
 - iii. That is untreated or partially treated from the treatment system.
 - iv. To land not owned, operated, controlled, or contracted by the Discharger.

The Winery Order Requirements

The Winery Order Requirements



Requirement callouts

- Every requirement has a unique identifier.
- Consists of alternating numbers and letters.
- Sublevels are each indented inwards.

Winery tiers based on volume of water generated and discharged (Table 1). The flow shall not exceed the application of the application selected to, and

commensurate with, the complexity of the discharge regulated under each tier.

Example 1

- Winery Order, pg 3, #12.a

12. Wineries with process water design flows less than 10,000 gallons per year (gal/yr) are unlikely to degrade water quality and are therefore exempt from this General Order provided they comply with the following:

- The Discharger shall not discharge waste:
 - To surface waters or surface water drainage courses.
 - That is classified as "hazardous," as defined in California Code of Regulations (CCR), title 23, section 2521, or classified as "designated," as defined in Water Code section 13173.
 - That is untreated or partially treated from the treatment system.
 - To land not owned, operated, controlled, or contracted by the Discharger.

iv. Materials or waste shall not be applied in a manner that disturbs, damages, or compacts the subsurface disposal area.

d. The discharge of treated wastewater from separate process water and domestic wastewater systems may be directed to the same subsurface disposal area if approved by the regional water board and provided the required Tier 2-4 conditions specified in Section D.4 b Discharge Specifications (Tiers 2, 3, and 4), Subsurface Disposal Specifications are met.

D. DISCHARGE SPECIFICATIONS (TIERS 2, 3, AND 4)

1) General Specifications

a. Salt Control

i. The Discharger shall reduce the salinity loading to the process water treatment and disposal systems and the underlying groundwater by implementing good housekeeping practices, source control and waste minimization measures (e.g., solids screening, pressure washing, wastewater and chemical reuse), and by minimizing the use of salt-containing and non-biodegradable chemicals.

ii. The flow-weighted annual average FDS concentration of the process water discharge from the winery shall be measured prior to treatment. If the facility is meeting the annual average flow-weighted average FDS concentration plus 320 mg/L.

Example 2

- Winery Order, pg 36, #D.1.a.ii.c.1

a) Tiers 2 and 3: If

Salt Control Plan if directed to do so by the regional water board if site-specific conditions indicate a threat to water quality.

b) Tier 4: If the FDS threshold is exceeded, the Discharger shall submit a Salt Control Plan.

c) In lieu of submitting a Salt Control Plan, Dischargers enrolled in a State Water Board or regional water board accepted sustainability program that contains salt control measures to address discharges in this General Order may implement the sustainability program salt control measures instead. The Discharger shall certify that the required salt control measures have been implemented.

(1) Tiers 3 and 4: The regional water board may direct Dischargers to submit a Salt Control Plan in addition to implementing the sustainability program measures if site-specific conditions indicate a threat to water quality.

Electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI) to Notice of Applicability (NOA)

Discharger - eNOI

- **Submit Application Package**
 - eNOI – via the California Integrated Water Quality System
 - Attach Documentation
 - Technical report – required for all wineries
 - Existing Facilities – proposed compliance schedule
 - Other supporting documents
 - Signed NOI and Fee
 - Signed copy of NOI must be submitted to the regional board
 - Application fee is equal to the annual fee – changed each year

Apply (cont):

Electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI) to Notice of Applicability (NOA)

Regional Board - NOA

- Reviews Application Package

- All three parts must be submitted before review begins
- Reach out to Discharger as needed
 - Example: additional facility information, technical report clarifications, etc.

- Issue Notice of Applicability

- Tier determination
- If relevant - approved compliance schedule
- Monitoring & Reporting Program
 - Compliance with the Monitoring and Reporting program begins after a NOA is issued

Apply:

Discharger - eNOI

- Submit Application Package
 - eNOI
 - Attach Documentation
 - Signed NOI and Fee

Regional Board - NOA

- Reviews Application Package

ATTACHMENT C TECHNICAL REPORT FOR REPORT OF WASTE DISCHARGE

Pursuant to Water Code, section 13267, Dischargers may be required to furnish, under penalty of perjury, technical or monitoring program reports as a condition of the General Order. The information presented in the technical report is required by Water Code, section 13267 and is relied upon by the regional water board to prepare the Notice of Applicability (NOA) for coverage under the General Order. The Discharger shall ensure that the information presented in the technical report is accurate. Misstatements, errors, or omissions that exist in the technical report may be included in the NOA and become enforceable.

The technical report outline presented below is intended to provide general guidance for Dischargers and consultants and should be tailored to a facility's site-specific conditions as appropriate. Submitting a technical report consistent with this format will assist the Discharger in providing the necessary information to the regional water board, expedite review of the technical report, and streamline the permitting process. It is recommended that the Discharger contact their regional water board to discuss the project before preparing the technical report. The State Water Board and regional water board may provide procedures for electronic submittal or modifications to the technical report, its associated supporting information or documents, and the issuance of the NOA.

1. **Complete:** Winery eNOI
 - a. **Questionnaire:** Facility data (e.g., ponds, subsurface disposal, etc.)
 - b. **Attachments:** Technical Report, other documentation
2. **Submit:** eNOI, fee (use form ID), and signed NOI (scan PDF or mail)

Uploading Technical Report to the eNOI is REQUIRED!

Tab 9 – Attachments

All required and applicable documents must be uploaded in the *Attachments* tab. The attachment description and title should be explicit for document contents.

Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) for Wineries

The State Water Board has developed General WDRs for winery process water (Winery Order) for wineries and other similar facilities (collectively referred as wineries) with activities related to producing wine or grape juice that generate winery waste and discharge it to land for reuse or disposal. The Winery Order is applicable statewide and is intended to streamline and improve permitting consistency.

The State Water Board will continue to engage the public and stakeholders as part of the Winery Order implementation process and this website will be updated with related information as it becomes available.

On January 20, 2021, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted Resolution No. 2021-0001 for the California Environmental Quality Act Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Waste Discharge Requirements for Winery Process Water and associated General Order.

(1) Submit for any month in which a violation or exceedance occurs. Also submit as the transmittal letter for each monitoring report.


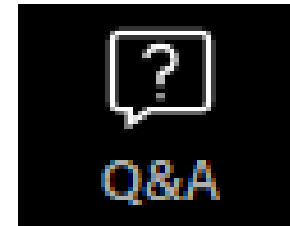
(2) The second semi-annual monitoring results may be incorporated into the Annual Report instead of submitted as standalone Semi-annual Report.

(3) An abbreviated Annual Report format is provided for Tier 1 Dischargers.
