GRANT DEED

FOR A VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

IRENE BUSK, Successor Trustee of the Rodney Busk Trust Dated March 21, 1986, as amended February 22, 1998 and IRENE BUSK as her sole and separate property; (together, "Grantor")

hereby GRANT to

THE NATURE CONSERVANCY, a District of Columbia non-profit corporation, ("Grantce")

the real property in the County of Siskiyou, State of California, more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto (the "Property").

TOGETHER WITH all buildings, improvements, and fixtures thereon, and all water and water rights, minerals and mineral rights and other surface and subsurface rights (to the extent owned by Grantor), permits, hereditaments, easements, incidents and appurtenances thereto, including any and all water and water rights, surface and/or groundwater, appurtenant to or underlying the Property. Rights to surface water shall include any and all riparian rights and no severance of any riparian rights that exist at the time of this grant shall occur because of this grant. Rights to surface water also include any and all appropriative rights, including all rights confirmed to the Property by the court in the matter of the determination of the relative rights, based upon prior appropriation, of the various claimants to the waters of Shasta River and its tributaries, in Siskiyou County, California, no. 7035, entered December 30, 1932, as amended or modified (hereinafter "Decree") and as originally denoted as the relative rights of John, Manuel, and Frank Louie and as modified to reflect an ownership in Rodney Busk. The rights herein granted are without reservation, those associated with the diversions

designated in the Decree for diversions nos. 167-172 and 243-246. Rights associated with diversions nos. 241 and 242 are herein granted, with the grantor reserving a right to divert that quantity of water necessary for the reasonable and beneficial uses, on the "Retained Lands" (which Retained Lands consist of 398 acres, more or less, and are described with specificity in the attached Exhibit B), consistent with the limitation and obligations contained in the Conservation Easement. The "Conservation Easement" is that certain Grant Deed of Conservation Easement recorded on March 6, 2009, as Instrument No. 04-000)/57 of Official Records ____, of the Office of the County Recorder of Siskiyou county. At all times, water use on the Retained Lands will be limited to the acreage identified in the Decree for the respective diversion nos., subject to the obligations associated with the exchange of water from water sources, as that obligation is set forth in the Conservation Easement. Grantor will cooperate with Grantee to conform the water rights associated with the Property, through appropriate modification of the Decree, or otherwise, so that it is consistent with the grant and will take no actions that will violate the Decree or otherwise adversely affect the continued validity of the Property's water rights.

Attachment 2 to Accompany the Petition for Instream Flow Dedication (Water Code 1707) For Water Rights within the Shasta River Adjudication and Decree 7035, 1932 RE: Diversion No. 241, Big Springs Creek (6.71 cfs) The Nature Conservancy

Project Description

Big Springs Creek is a spring sourced stream that flows into the Shasta River at River Mile 33.5, providing essential cold water flows and cold water habitat for coho salmon, Chinook salmon, and steelhead trout. 10.0 cubic feet per second (cfs) may be diverted from Diversion Point #241, pursuant to the Shasta River Adjudication and Decree (Decree) in Siskiyou County, California.¹ TNC holds the right to the 10 cfs from Diversion #241, subject to Irene Busk's reservation of the right to divert that quantity of water necessary for the reasonable and beneficial uses, on her retained lands, consistent with the limitations and obligations of a conservation easement held by TNC. By this Petition for Instream Flow Dedication (Petition)², TNC seeks to a dedicate up to 6.71 cfs of the total 10.0 cfs to instream uses for the purpose of preserving and enhancing fish and wildlife resources.

As set forth in the Decree, the total water rights are for direct diversion from the natural or developed flow of Big Springs Creek during the period between April 1st and October 1st of each year for beneficial use on 451.9 acres. Of these decreed acres, TNC owns 303.2 acres and Irene Busk owns 148.7 acres. Diversion #241 has two priority dates of April 1, 1872 for 8.60 cfs and April 1, 1893 on the remaining 1.4 cfs (Priorities 2 and 15 respectively). Diversions within the Big Springs Creek system are administered as part of the Scott and Shasta Watermaster District (SSWD).³

Pursuant to this Petition, water withdrawals from Diversion #241 in certain circumstances will be reduced or curtailed during some or all of the irrigation season for the purpose of preserving and enhancing fish and wildlife resources in Big Springs Creek and the Shasta River. Decisions about whether and when diversions will be reduced or curtailed will be made by TNC and the Department of Fish and Game in coordination with the Watermaster, based on natural flow conditions, water temperatures, biological needs of fish and wildlife and other relevant considerations.

TNC requests that the water that is subject to this dedication be in addition to water that is, or may in the future be required, to be used for instream purposes to satisfy any applicable federal, state, or local regulatory requirements governing water quantity, water quality, instream flows, fish and wildlife, wetlands, recreation, or other instream beneficial uses. TNC further requests that the California State Water Resources Control Board and all other state and local agencies, as well as the courts, not credit the water subject to this petition towards compliance with any regulatory requirements, including any existing or future minimum instream flow requirements, but rather this water be in addition to (or applied on top of) any future required bypass or minimum instream flow requirements (per §1707 (c) (1)).

¹ Judgment No. 7035 entered into the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of Siskiyou on December 30, 1932 (Shasta River Decree).

² As the holder of a pre-1914 appropriative right, TNC is not required to obtain State Water Resources Control Board approval to change the place of use, purpose of use or point of diversion of its water right. Water Code §1706; see also *Barnes v. Hussa* (2006) 136 Cal.App.4th 1358. Nonetheless, TNC submits this Petition pursuant to Water Code §1707 in the interest of ensuring that its proposal to include as a purpose of use *preserving and enhancing fish and wildlife resources* is adequately documented and enforceable.

³ On December 22, 2011, the Siskiyou County Superior Court granted the petition of the Scott and Shasta Watermaster District (SSWD) to replace the Department of Water Resources as watermaster. The SSWD began to provide watermaster services on or about February 1, 2012.

Present Purpose of Use:

Irrigation.

Proposed Purpose of Use:

Irrigation and preserving and enhancing fish and wildlife resources.

Present Place of Use:

Since TNC purchased the property in 2009, irrigation has continued as it had prior to TNC's acquisition. However, since 1932 when the decree was adopted, the place of use for POD #241 has changed. There have been slight changes over time due to improved irrigation infrastructure and more efficient use of other nearby PODs. The acreage listed in Table 1 and shown on Map 1 describes the acres outlined in the decree and also shows the revisions to the place of use. This amendment does not change the total use on any given day for either irrigation or instream benefits and will not exceed the decreed amount of the water right from Diversion #241.

Big Springs Creek Unit Irrigation

The Big Springs Creek Diversion #241 is located at the western end of Big Spring Lake, approximately 2.3 miles upstream from Big Springs Creek confluence with the Shasta River. The lake is formed by a man-made dam which facilitates the gravity diversion of water at Diversion #241. To divert water, the headgate at Diversion #241 is opened and water flows approximately 0.6 mile to the TNC eastern property boundary. This water flows through approximately 3 miles of earthen ditch and surface irrigates pastures to the north of Big Springs Creek.

Other Water Diverters in the Project Area

Table 2 shows a list of the other water diverters in the project area. Those diverters above the bold solid line have a lower priority than the Priority 2 right associated with Diversion #241 (5.81 cfs of the 6.71 cfs total right). Those diverters above the bold dashed line have a lower priority than the Priority 15 right associated with Diversion #241 (0.9 cfs of the 6.71 cfs total right). These lower priority rights are those rights that will need to be bypassed in the event that there is not enough water in the system to accommodate the instream dedication and all other water rights downstream.

Please note that these water rights and the Shasta Big Springs Ranch are encumbered by a conservation easement held by the Department of Fish and Game.






