East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) holds Permit 10478 (Application 13156), which was obtained to supplement EBMUD's pre-existing municipal water right at Pardee Reservoir (License 11109), and authorizes direct diversion and storage at both Pardee Reservoir and the adjacent Camanche Reservoir (collectively the Mokelumne Project) during December 1 through July 1 for municipal purposes. Withdrawals from storage under the Permit can occur year-round. The Permit also authorizes Camanche Dam as a point of rediversion for waters previously stored upstream in Pardee Reservoir. The Permit and authorized Project operations were modified by the State Water Resources Control Board's (State Water Board) 1960 approval of a Changed Plan of Development. The purpose of this Petition for Change (Petition) to EBMUD's Permit 10478 is to request the addition of a term to Permit 10478 to more explicitly describe the manner in which EBMUD utilizes the water stored in Camanche Reservoir. The term makes a technical clarification to conform to the principles and procedures that the State Water Board currently uses to analyze diversions, as described further below. This Petition proposes no other changes to Permit 10478.

Over the course of the past several years, EBMUD and Division of Water Rights (Division) staff have analyzed diversion and use of water under Permit 10478. As indicated above, Permit 10478 and the approved Plan of Development authorize diversions and storage at both Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs, and, together with requirements such as flood control, fishery protections and downstream obligations, result in the need to operate the system as a single, unified Mokelumne Project. Under this unified system, EBMUD diverts its municipal supply from Pardee Reservoir while operating Camanche Reservoir to support those diversions while concurrently making releases from Camanche to satisfy downstream senior rights and regulatory and environmental obligations. In this way the Project as a whole can provide the municipal water supplies authorized to be diverted and stored under Permit 10478 while meeting all other regulatory requirements with releases from the reservoirs. The analysis of these quantities for the combined reservoirs, or effectively a single reservoir, confirms beneficial use of water under Permit 10478 by direct diversion, and also by withdrawal from storage, with the withdrawals occurring only when there is a corresponding net depletion in the combined storage of Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs.

Accordingly, this Petition proposes to include the term identified below in Permit 10478 in order to clarify the manner in which the authorized diversions are occurring and to account for diversions consistent with existing water right limitations, particularly relative to withdrawals from storage under Permit 10478. Specifically, the proposed term would be a technical clarification to ensure that withdrawals from storage into the Aqueducts at Pardee Reservoir under Permit 10478 occur only when there is a net depletion of a corresponding quantity of water in the combined storage at Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs.

The term requires a reduction in the combined storage of Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs when diversions into the Aqueducts are accounted for as withdrawals from storage under Permit 10478. This term ensures consistency with water right limitations and assures no injury to downstream legal water users and instream beneficial uses. This proposed term does not alter the release and bypass requirements for the lower Mokelumne River and is consistent with EBMUD's existing operations and with the Permit 10478 authorizations.

This Petition is intended only to clarify EBMUD's existing rights and does not initiate a new water right or expand EBMUD's existing rights to divert from the Mokelumne River, as the water withdrawn from storage at the authorized points of diversion is water that is currently authorized under Permit 10478. In addition, no construction is required as a result of this Petition. With this proposed term, EBMUD will continue to meet its water supply needs and will continue its longstanding practices in meeting various state and federal environmental objectives and operational requirements, including, but not limited to (a) fishery flows; (b) temperature management; (c) flood control; and (d) downstream water rights.
