he City of Rialto ("Rialto") is proposing the re-use of recycled water in its service area as well as the marketing of surplus recycled water delivers outside of the Rialto municipal service area. Pursuant to guidelines established by the California Department of Public Heal na Regional Quality Control Board, Rialto's Waste Water Treatment Plant ("WWTP") treats effluent to a quality sufficient for discharge na River. Under current conditions, that discharge enters the Santa Ana watershed through a point of discharge into a concrete-line proximately 1,750 feet removed from the river itself. The location of the discharge conduit and receiving concrete-lined channel is series of photographs attached as Figures 1 and 2. At the terminus of that channel, the recycled water enters the Santa Ana River. Onto the river, the recycled water is no longer available to Rialto for beneficial purposes. In addition to Rialto's own potential re-use of ater agencies and private parties have expressed an interest in obtaining recycled water from Rialto for further beneficial uses. Reconveyed to these agencies and private parties would be used to meet additional direct uses within the Santa Ana River watershed a conveyed to the groundwater recharge within the watershed. The re-use of Rialto's recycled water will reduce demand for both improundwater deliveries in the proposed areas of use as well as other areas to which the recycled water will be conveyed.
