DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED CHANGES

South Sutter Water District (District) is proposing a transfer of up to 10,000 acre-feet (AF) of previously stored water to participating State Water Contractor (SWC) Agencies. The District historically has not been involved in water transfers, with the exception of the Bay-Delta Settlement Agreement, and similar transfers in 2008-2010. Increased costs associated with the FERC relicensing process, the Probable Maximum Flood (PMF) requirements, and other regulatory processes have resulted in the District considering a water transfer to aid in offsetting these large expenses in order to maintain its ability to provide an affordable surface water supply.

Under the proposed transfer, up to 10,000 AF of previously stored water would be released from Camp Far West Reservoir (Reservoir) and the Camp Far West Diversion Dam (Diversion Dam). This water would flow downstream in the Bear River, thence the Feather River, thence the Sacramento River to the Delta where it would be rediverted at the State Water. Project's Banks Pumping Plant, Barker Slough Pumping Plant, and/or San Luis Reservoir for use within the service area of the participating Agencies. In absence of the proposed transfer, this water would be delivered to District landowners or retained in storage. The proposed temporary transfer does not involve any construction or other physical changes to District facilities.

Petitions for temporary transfer of water pursuant to Water Code Section 1725 are exempt from CEQA. In addition, the Governor's Proclamation of a Continued State of Emergency dated April 25, 2014 suspends environmental review required by CEQA to allow water transfers to be expiated. Reclamation has prepared an Environmental Assessment/Initial Study (EA/IS) for water transfers during 2014 pursuant to the requirements under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Although Reclamation's EA/IS did not attempt to address the Company's proposed water transfer directly, the cumulative effects section includes a water transfer from the Company of up to the quantity proposed for transfer during 2014. Reclamation has adopted a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) in regard to the proposed transfer. Copies of the EA/IS and FONSI are available upon request.

PHOTOGRAPHS

The present and proposed points of diversion include existing facilities that are well known and documented with the Division of Water Rights (Division). In addition, the present and proposed places of use are also well known and documented with the Division. Therefore,

for these reasons, photographs of the present and proposed points of diversion and places of use are not included.

MAPS

The present point of diversion, points of rediversion, and place of use are shown on a map filed with the Division for License 11118. The proposed additional points of rediversion SWP's Harvey O. Banks Pumping Plant, SWP's Barker Slough Pumping Plant, and San Luis Reservoir are shown on maps filed with the Division for Application 5630. The proposed additional place of use is a portion of the SWP service area, as shown on Map 1878-2 and -3 on file with the Division under Application 5630.
