ORDER CORRECTING THE
DESCRIPTION OF THE PLACE OF USE

WHEREAS:

1. License 4481 was issued to Hallie Hyde Irwin, William Hyde Irwin, Edwin Gillette, Hyde Gillette, Helen Gillette Chapin and Marietta Gillette, and filed with the County Recorder of San Joaquin County on January 9, 1957.
2. License 4481 was subsequently assigned to Augusta-Bixler Farms, A Partnership.
3. It has been determined that the description of the place of use should be corrected. The correction is needed to correctly state the Range as 5E, rather than the current incorrect 5W.
4. The State Water Resources Control Board has determined that said correction in the description of the place of use will not initiate a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of the water and that good and sufficient cause has been shown for said correction.
5. License condition pertaining to the continuing authority of the Board should be updated to conform to Standard Permit Term 12 as contained in Section 780(a), Title 23, of the California Code of Regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. A description of the lands or the place where such water is put to beneficial use is as follows:
 - 5.2 acres within Section 14, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 3.4 acres within Section 15, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 0.4 acre within Section 21, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 455.4 acres within Section 22, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 284.7 acres within Section 23, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 3.0 acres within Section 24, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 69.1 acres within Section 26, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 278.0 acres within Section 27, T1S, R5E, MDB&M
 - 5.5 acres within Section 28, T1S, R5E, MDB&M

1104.7 acres total, as shown on map on file with State Water Resources Control Board.

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2. License condition relating to the Board's continuing authority be amended to read:


Pursuant to California Water Code Sections 100 and 275, and the common law public trust doctrine, all rights and privileges under this license, including method of diversion, method of use, and quantity of water diverted, are subject to the continuing authority of the State Water Resources Control Board in accordance with law and in the interest of the public welfare to protect public trust uses and to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use, or unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

The continuing authority of the Board may be exercised by imposing specific requirements over and above those contained in this license with a view to eliminating waste of water and to meeting the reasonable water requirements of licensee without unreasonable draft on the source. Licensee may be required to implement a water conservation plan, features of which may include but not necessarily be limited to: (1) reusing or reclaiming the water allocated; (2) using water reclaimed by another entity instead of all or part of the water allocated; (3) restricting diversions so as to eliminate agricultural tailwater or to reduce return flow; (4) suppressing evaporation losses from water surfaces; (5) controlling phreatophytic growth; and (6) installing, maintaining, and operating efficient water measuring devices to assure compliance with the quantity limitations of this license and to determine accurately water use as against reasonable water requirements for the authorized project. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such specific requirements are physically and financially feasible and are appropriate to the particular situation.

The continuing authority of the Board also may be exercised by imposing further limitations on the diversion and use of water by the licensee in order to protect public trust uses. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such action is consistent with California Constitution Article X, Section 2; is consistent with the public interest and is necessary to preserve or restore the uses protected by the public trust.

(the date of inspection) to the satisfaction of the State Water Rights Board of a right to the use of the water of
Grant Line Canal in San Joaquin County

tributary to Old River thence San Joaquin River

for the purpose of irrigation and stockwatering
under Permit 8820 of the State Water Rights Board and that said right to the use of said water has been
perfected in accordance with the laws of California, the Rules and Regulations of the State Water Rights Board and the
terms of the said permit; that the priority of the right herein confirmed dates from October 26, 1950
and that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited
to the amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed nine and five tenths (9.5) cubic
feet per second to be diverted from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

The equivalent of such continuous flow allowance for any thirty day period may
be diverted in a shorter time if there be no interference with other vested rights.

The point of diversion of such water is located north eighty-two degrees forty-five
minutes west (N 82° 45' W), one thousand seven hundred fifty (1,750) feet from
E $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 27, T 1 S, R 5 E, MDB&M, being within SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said
Section 27.

A description of the lands or the place where such water is put to beneficial use is as follows:

5.2 acres within Section 14, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
3.4 acres within Section 15, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
0.4 acres within Section 21, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
455.4 acres within Section 22, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
284.7 acres within Section 23, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
3.0 acres within Section 24, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
69.1 acres within Section 26, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
278.0 acres within Section 27, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
5.5 acres within Section 28, T 1 S, R 5 W, MDB&M.
1104.7 acres total as shown on map on file with State Water Rights Board.

All rights and privileges under this license including method of diversion, method of use and quantity of water
diverted are subject to the continuing authority of the State Water Rights Board in accordance with law and in the
interest of the public welfare to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or unreasonable method of
diversion of said water.

Reports shall be filed promptly by licensee on appropriate forms which will be provided for the purpose from time
to time by the State Water Rights Board.

The right hereby confirmed to the diversion and use of water is restricted to the point or points of diversion herein
specified and to the lands or place of use herein described.

This license is granted and licensee accepts all rights herein confirmed subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1625. Each license shall be in such form and contain such terms as may be prescribed by the board.

Section 1626. All licenses shall be under the terms and conditions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1627. A license shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code) but no longer.

Section 1628. Every license shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a license is issued takes the license subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1629. Every licensee, if he accepts a license does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any license granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any licensee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale to or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any licensee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).

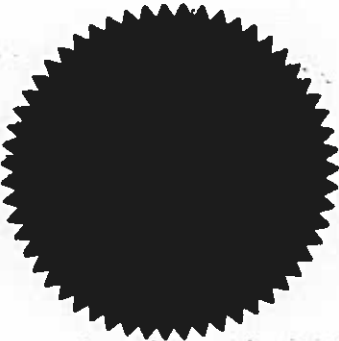
Section 1630. At any time after the expiration of twenty years after the granting of a license, the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State shall have the right to purchase the works and property occupied and used under the license and the works built or constructed for the enjoyment of the rights granted under the license.

Section 1631. In the event that the State, or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or political subdivision of the State so desiring to purchase and the owner of the works and property cannot agree upon the purchase price, the price shall be determined in such manner as is now or may hereafter be provided by law for determining the value of property taken in eminent domain proceedings.

ORDER ALLOWING CORRECTION OF DESCRIPTION OF SOURCE

WHEREAS License 1286 was issued to Mrs. Louisa Stark and was filed with the County Recorder of San Joaquin County on March 24, 1933, and

WHEREAS said license was subsequently assigned to Theodore Stark, Carl Stark, Margaret Lamb, Louise Murray and Eleanor Lawrence, and

WHEREAS the State Water Rights Board has found that the correction of description of source under said license for which petition was submitted on August 10, 1966, will not operate to the injury of any other legal user of water, and

WHEREAS the Board has approved and allowed said correction and has directed that an order be issued to describe said source in accordance with said petition;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that permission be and the same is hereby granted to correct the description of the source under said License 1286 to read as follows, to wit:

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, That Mrs. Louisa Stark, Stockton, California

has made proof to the satisfaction of the Division of Water Resources of California of a right to the use of the waters of Middle River, Salmon Slough and Grant Line Canal in San Joaquin County

tributary of San Joaquin River

for the purpose of irrigation use under Permit 2610

of the Division of Water Resources and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of California, the rules and regulations of the Division of Water Resources and the terms of the said permit; that the priority of the right herein confirmed dates from June 6, 1926

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to the amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed sixteen and sixty eight hundredths (16.68) cubic feet per second from about April 1st to about November 1st of each season. In case of rotation the equivalent of such continuous flow allowance for any thirty day period may be diverted in a shorter time if there be no interference with other vested rights.

The points of diversion of such water are located as follows:

1. Middle River at a point South twenty three degrees West (S. 23° W) nineteen hundred sixty (1960) feet from the north end of steel bridge over Middle River; being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, T 1 S, R 5 E, M.D.B. & M.

2. Salmon Slough at a point South twenty one degrees fifteen minutes West (S. 21° 15' W) ten thousand one hundred seventy (10,170) feet from the north end of said steel bridge; being within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, T 1 S, R 5 E, M.D.B. & M.

3. Salmon Slough at a point South fifty one degrees fifteen minutes West (S. 51° 15' W) eleven thousand eight hundred twenty (11,820) feet from the north end of said steel bridge; being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 27, T 1 S, R 5 E, M.D.B. & M.

4. Grant Line Canal at a point South forty nine degrees eight minutes West (S. 49° 08' W) eight thousand six hundred fifty (8,650) feet from the north end of said steel bridge; being within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 27, T 1 S, R 5 E, M.D.B. & M.

SECTIONS 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35, T 1 S, R 5 E, M.D.B. & M. as shown on map filed June 8, 1926.

As there is a possibility that there will not be sufficient water in San Joaquin River during the latter part of the irrigation season to satisfy all requirements, this license is issued subject to the express condition that the use hereunder may be regulated by the Division of Water Resources during such periods of water scarcity to the end that such use will not interfere with rights under prior applications.

The right to the diversion and use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the point of diversion herein specified and to the lands or place of use herein described.
