

Background on Mill, Deer, and Antelope Creeks

- Mill, Deer, and Antelope Creeks provide critical habitat for Central Valley spring-run Chinook salmon and Central Valley steelhead
- Extinction risk of spring-run populations on Mill and Deer Creeks has increased from low or moderate to high in recent years



Past Water Board Actions

- Emergency curtailment regulations were implemented in all three creeks during the drought in 2014/2015 and in Mill and Deer Creeks in 2021/2022
- Emergency regulations were not implemented in Antelope Creek during this most recent drought because of the adoption of a Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement in 2020



Direction to Conduct Scientific Basis Investigation

- The Governor issued his California Salmon Strategy for a Hotter, Drier Future, which instructed the Water Board and the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) to begin reviewing and analyzing instream flow recommendations for Mill, Deer, and Antelope Creeks
- The Board received a letter from DFW expressing concern over the survival of salmonids in these creeks along with comprehensive instream flow recommendations to support their survival



Purpose of the Workshop

- To seek input on the best available science regarding instream flows for protections of salmonids to inform drafting of a scientific basis report
- To solicit input on possible flow scenarios and other strategies that should be evaluated to support salmonid survival in Mill, Deer, and Antelope Creeks



Next Steps

- Board will prepare a draft Scientific Basis Report informed by DFW's recommendation and the feedback received at this workshop
- Release of draft Scientific Basis Report and additional opportunity for public comment before finalizing report
