- State Water Contractors participated in the SWRCB workshop in 2001
- described in the draft Staff Report: In general, SWC support the position of CDFG
- this time Reviewing the narrative salmon objective is not necessary at
- Concur that ongoing monitoring and restoration programs are being evaluated for their effects
- Also believe ongoing restoration efforts undertaken and that the narrative objective is being achieved through CALFED and other programs are working

- Most recent CDFG data indicate:
- each of the last 4 years Doubling of natural production already achieved for fall-run – for
- Doubling of late fall-run achieved in 1999 and 2002
- with doubling of natural production achieved in 1998 **Spring-run** data show a consistent upward trend since 1994 –
- endangered to threatened to the point that NOAA Fisheries is now recommending (Fed. Reg. 6/14/04) that the listing of winter-run be downgraded from Winter-run doubling not achieved yet. But progress being made
- The SWC support NOAA position that winter-run listing be Fisheries supporting that position downgraded and have submitted comments to NOAA

- each river system and each tributary SWRCB in 1995 WQCP also did not attempt to set an objective of doubling for each race of salmon on
- Also an issue before the courts reviewing D-1641
- each race on each stream position that neither federal nor state law requires a doubling of The SWRCB has taken – and successfully defended – the

- production "...of anadromous fish in Central Valley CVPIA § 3406 (b)(1) which speaks only to Doubling by river/stream and race is not required by rivers and streams... implementation of a program to double natural
- It does not say "each race of each anadromous fish"
- It does not say "every river and every stream"
- The existing narrative doubling objective is consistent with federal law and with state law

## Most importantly, the existing narrative doubling objective is working

- already doubled (fall-run and late fall-run) Natural production of 2 of the 4 races of salmon has
- Consistent upward progress made on third race (spring-run)
- NOAA proposing to downgrade the listing of the 4th race (winter-run)
- doubled Overall, salmon in-river production for all races is already

- In 1995 WQCP/D-1641, SWP/CVP were required to reduce exports by
- > 325,000 acre feet on average every year
- By 750,000 acre feet on average in critical years
- The best available data show the narrative objective is not broken, but is working

As CDFG has already told the SWRCB, the narrative objective does not need to be reviewed or changed
