IN THE MATTER OF WATER USE ON THE PROPERTIES OF CONRADS FAMILY INVESTMENTS INC

Water Right IDs: SG007249, S024629

INFORMATION ORDER FOR WATER USE IN THE SCOTT RIVER WATERSHED ISSUED NOVEMBER 14, 2024

FINDINGS:

- On December 19, 2023, the State Water Board adopted the Scott River and Shasta River Watersheds Drought Emergency Requirements (hereinafter "Regulation" or "Emergency Regulation") which went into effect February 1, 2024. The Emergency Regulation provides curtailment authority in the Scott and Shasta watersheds, establishes minimum instream flow requirements, and provides information order authority in the Scott River and Shasta River watersheds. The minimum instream flow requirements were established to protect fall -run Chinook salmon, threatened Southern Oregon/Northern California Coast coho salmon, and culturally significant steelhead. Resolution No. 2023-0047 adopted the Emergency Regulation and describes the need for the Emergency Regulation and its intent.
- 2. Section 875 of the Emergency Regulation grants the Deputy Director for the Division of Water Rights (Division) the authority to issue Curtailment Orders requiring diverters to cease or limit their diversions.
- 3. On July 23, 2024, the Deputy Director for the State Water Board Division of Water Rights (Division) issued the Order Imposing Water Right Curtailment and Requiring Reporting for Surface Water Rights in the Scott River Watershed (Order WR 2024-0024-DWR).
- 4. On July 24, 2024, the Deputy Director issued Order Imposing Water Right Curtailment and Requiring Reporting for Adjudicated Groundwater Rights and Known Groundwater Diversions Associated with Parcels Listed in Attachment A in the Scott River Watershed (Order WR 2024-0025-DWR). This imposed curtailments on adjudicated groundwater rights and groundwater rights associated with parcels in the Scott River watershed outside of municipal service areas.

- 5. Both Order WR 2024-0024-DWR and Order WR 2024-0025-DWR required submission of an online Curtailment Certification Form in accordance with section 875.6 subdivision (a) and allowed for curtailment exceptions applicable to nonconsumptive instream uses, human health and safety needs, and livestock watering, as described in sections 875.1, 875.2, and 875.3 of the Emergency Regulation. If an exception was claimed, the Respondent must also self-certify or submit a petition online at https://public.waterboards.ca.gov/WRInfo.
- 6. On August 9, 2024, the Deputy Director issued "Addendum To Attachment A: Groundwater Rights In The Scott River Watershed Associated With Order WR 2024-0025-DWR: Water Right Curtailment And Requiring Reporting For Groundwater Rights In The Scott River Watershed" (Parcel Addendum). This Addendum updated Attachment A of the Order and clarified the parcels subject to curtailment. No additional diverters were included in the Parcel Addendum.
- 7. On August 23, 2024, "Addendum 1 Temporary and Conditional Suspension to Scott River Curtailments Orders" (Addendum 1) to Order WR 2024-0024-DWR and Order WR 2024-0025-DWR was sent ahead of an expected storm event suspending curtailments upon flows reaching, and maintaining, a rate of 35 cfs. Should flows have met this condition, diverters were directed to notify the State Water Board of their diversions and update the diversion amounts daily. However, the storm event did not result in increased flows above 35 cfs, and therefore diversions remained curtailed.
- 8. On September 6, 2024, "Addendum 2 Scott River Groundwater Curtailment Suspension and Required Information for Potential Future Surface Water Diversions" (Addendum 2) was sent to Scott River water right holders. Curtailments were conditionally suspended for groundwater diverters upon the diverter contacting State Water Board staff indicating they are diverting and upon the Drought Emergency Minimum Flows being met at the USGS Fort Jones gage.
- 9. On September 17, 2024, "Addendum 3: Update to Scott River Surface Water Curtailments for Farmer's Ditch Company" (Addendum 3) was sent to Scott River water right holders. The addendum applies only to Farmer's Ditch Company, as that was the only surface water diverter that submitted a request to the State Water Board under the provisions of Addendum 2. Addendum 3 allowed only Farmer's Ditch Company to divert under certain conditions set to expire at 11:59 pm on September 30, 2024.
- 10. On September 27, 2024, "Addendum 4: Update to Scott River Surface Water Curtailments for Farmer's Ditch Company and Scott Valley Irrigation District" (Addendum 4) was sent to Scott River water right holders. Addendum 4 applied only to Farmer's Ditch Company and Scott Valley Irrigation District, as they were the only surface water diverters that submitted a request to the State Water Board under the provisions of the previous addenda. Addendum 4 further states, "If you did not submit a request under the addendum (issued September 6, 2024 and

September 17, 2024), your surface water right(s) remains curtailed (unless you have a local cooperative solution or meet an exception to curtailment like human health and safety or minimum livestock watering)." Addendum 4 expired on September 30, 2024 at 11:59pm.

- 11. On October 15, 2024, "Addendum 5: Update to Scott River Surface Water Curtailments for Farmer's Ditch Company and Scott Valley Irrigation District" (Addendum 5) was sent to Scott River water right holders. Addendum 5 applies only to Farmer's Ditch Company and Scott Valley Irrigation District, as they were the only surface water diverters that submitted a request to the State Water Board under the provisions of the previous addenda. Addendum 5 further states, "Surface water diverters that have not submitted the requested information identified in Addendums 2 and 3 (issued September 6, 2024, and September 17, 2024, respectively) and received approval from the Board to divert under this addendum remain curtailed." Addendum 5 expires on October 31, 2024, at 11:59pm.
- 12. Conrads Family Investments Inc (Respondent) is the current owner of parcels in Attachment A, identified as APNs

parcels identify the place of use associated with Water Right IDs SG007249 and S024629.

- 13. The Respondent previously applied for a Change of Ownership on January 6, 2022 for Water Right ID SG003593. The Division confirmed the Change of Ownership with an effective date of January 6, 2022. The Division believes that the applicant listed an incorrect Water Right ID on their Change of Ownership application, as this was an identifier assigned to Richard Dews in 2021. The Division believes the correct Water Right ID that Respondent should have applied for is S024629.
- 14. Order WR 2024-0024-DWR curtailed surface water rights in the Scott River watershed effective July 24, 2024. This included S024629 in the mailing list, however it was sent addressed to the prior owner Richard Dews due to lack of proper ownership change and was inevitably returned to the Division.
- 15. Order WR 2024-0025 DWR curtailed all groundwater extraction associated with the Respondent's APNs (with limited exceptions) effective July 25, 2024, including SG007249. United States Postal Service (USPS) records indicate that delivery of Order No. WR 2024-0025 was attempted at the Respondent's address on July 26, 2024, but no authorized recipient was available, and the Order was returned to the Division on August 19, 2024.
- 16. On August 9, 2024, the Parcel Addendum was issued. USPS records indicate that delivery of the Parcel Addendum was attempted at your address on August 12, 2024, but no authorized recipient was available, and the Order was sent back to the Division on August 27 2024.

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- 17. On August 13 and 29, 2024, Division Enforcement staff observed active irrigation occurring within the Respondent's place of use. Division Enforcement staff were in a public right of way. The Respondent's diversions had been curtailed since July 25, 2024. Thus, Division Enforcement staff's observation of active irrigation prompted a Notice of Violation (NOV).
- 18. The NOV was issued on August 20, 2024 to the Respondent which included copies of Order No. WR 2024-0025-DWR and the Parcel Addendum that had previously failed delivery.
- 19. General Logistics Systems (GLS) confirms that the NOV package was delivered on August 21, 2024.
- 20. The Respondent submitted a 2024 Scott & Shasta Non Consumptive Use Certification and a 2024 Scott Parcel Curtailment Certification form on August 22, 2024, one day after receiving the NOV package. The Non-Consumptive Use Certification claimed an exemption to divert water for non-consumptive purposes, but the form did not indicate a qualifiable diversion under nonconsumptive use. This Order seeks to clarify information provided on that form.
- 21. On September 20, 2024, Division Enforcement staff observed a green agricultural field that suggest it was recently irrigated. Additional information is being requested in this Order to confirm whether irrigation occurred.
- 22. On October 2, 2024, Division Enforcement staff observed an agricultural field that appeared to have been recently cut. Additional information is being requested in order to verify irrigation related to this.
- 23. On September 6, 2024 to September 30, 2024, curtailments for groundwater diversions were lifted as long as the respondent reported his diversion to the Division as required by Addendum 2. The Respondent did not notify the Division of any diversion occurring during that period.
- 24. The purpose of this Information Order is to obtain information about additional days of diversion that may have occurred in violation of curtailment orders, and correct the outstanding Water Right ID ownership issue. This information is otherwise not readily obtainable because it depends on knowledge of water use on various land parcels.

25. The Division of Water Rights has created the Scott River Watershed Water Use Information Form which is attached to this Order. You must complete and return the form by email or US Postal Service to the address below:

26. Submittal of the Form is required within fourteen (14) days from the effective date of this Order. Timely reporting will allow the State Water Board to process the information efficiently during this drought emergency. The Deputy Director may grant additional time for the submission of information regarding water use upon a showing of good cause. Each recipient of this Order is responsible for immediately providing notice of any information order(s) to any or all agents, successors in interest, grantees, and assigns thereto required to provide complete information.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. This Information Order shall be effective on November 14, 2024
- 2. By November 28, 2024 you must submit, under penalty of perjury, the information described in this paragraph. Provide the following information on each water source serving their parcel(s) or used to provide water supply from **July 25, 2024 through the date of receiving this Information Order**:
 - 2.1 Information on all Surface Water Points of Diversion (if applicable)
 - 2.1.1 Coordinates identifying the location of each surface water point of diversion for which you have not already filed an Initial Statement of Diversion and Use
 - 2.1.2 For each surface water point of diversion, describe the following:
 - (a) Diversion maximum flow rate;
 - (b) Date(s) water was diverted;
 - (c) Quantity of water diverted;
 - 2.1.3 Quantity of water used for (1) irrigation, (2) livestock watering, (3) human health and safety, (4) diverted to storage;
 - 2.1.4 Describe the purpose if water used is for other purposes not listed
 - 2.2 Information on all Groundwater Points of Diversion
 - 2.2.1 Coordinates identifying the location of each groundwater well for which you have not already filed an Initial Statement of Diversion and Use;

- 2.2.2 The current maximum flow rate of each well;
- 2.2.3 For each date the wells operated:
 - (a) Quantity of water diverted;
 - (b) Quantity of water used for (1) irrigation, (2) livestock watering, (3) human health and safety, (4) diverted to storage; and
 - (3) numan nearin and safety, (4) diverted to s
 - (c) Diversion maximum flow rate.
- 2.3 Irrigation from July 25, 2024, through date of receiving this Information Order:(a) The parcel(s) where irrigation has occurred;
 - (b) Date(s) of irrigation on each field;
 - (c) Source(s) of water for irrigation;
 - (d) Number of irrigated acres per crop type; and,
 - (e) Amount of water used for irrigation on each field.
- 2.4 Additional information regarding non-consumptive uses as noted in attached Information Order Response Form.
- 2.5 Clarification regarding the ownership of Water Right ID S024629. If you use surface water at this point of diversion and therefore need to file an annual statement under this Water Right ID please submit a supplemental statement of change form using the link below, or the paper form provided in this information order package. https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/changerequest/
- 3. The Division may follow-up with additional information requests pursuant to this Order if necessary to clarify or complete the initial information request and response as necessary.
- 4. Violation of this Order is subject to enforcement and applicable penalties pursuant to Water Code section 1846.
- 5. Nothing in this Order is intended to or shall be construed to limit or preclude the State Water Board from exercising its authority under any statute, regulation, ordinance, or other law, including but not limited to, the authority to bring enforcement against diverters for unauthorized diversion or use in violation of Water Code section 1052.

6. Nothing in this Order shall excuse individual water right holders from meeting any more stringent requirements that may be imposed by applicable legally binding legislation, regulations, or a water right permit requirement. This Order does not authorize any act which results in the taking of a threatened, endangered, or candidate species or any act which is now prohibited, or becomes prohibited in the future, under either the California Endangered Species Act (Fish and Game Code sections 2050 to 2097) or the federal Endangered Species Act (16 U.S.C.A sections 1531 to 1544).
