NOTICE OF VIOLATION: FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH DIVERSION MEASUREMENT AND REPORTING REGULATION FOR WATER RIGHT ID A006603

To Johanna Fischer:

Water right owners must submit annual Water Diversion and Use Reports to the State Water Resources Control Board (“State Water Board” or “Board”) detailing how much water was diverted and used in the previous water year. These reports include progress reports by permittees and annual reports of licensees. These reports are due before February 1 of each year and must include information on the device and method used to calculate the amount of water diverted, as well as the measurement data collected by such a device. **Our records indicate that the annual Water Diversion and Use report for the water right identified above lacks the required information about your measurement device(s).**

Water Measurement and Reporting Regulations

In January 2016, the State Water Board adopted new water use measurement regulations. The regulations require the installation of measuring devices and set standards for monitoring and reporting diversions of water. The data submitted must reflect the amount of water diverted by each specific water right and each point of diversion. Data must also reflect the volume of water diverted. Data may not, for example, simply report a diversion rate or reservoir elevation.

These monitoring and reporting requirements are designed to improve the Board’s water supply awareness, while allowing water diverters the flexibility to determine how best to comply with the new requirements based on their individual circumstances. Water users were given until 2018 to comply with these regulations. The regulations can be found in Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, sections 931 through 938.

Violation

The Division of Water Rights has reviewed your Water Diversion and Use Report and found that you have failed to collect data at the required frequency. This failure constitutes a violation of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, section 933 (b)(1)(A).

Enforcement

Water Code section 1846 grants the Board the authority to impose an administrative civil liability in amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) for each day of violation of a regulation adopted by the Board.

Corrective Action

The Division of Water Rights requests that you correct the ongoing violation by immediately taking actions 1 or 2 as follows:

- 1. Submit an amended Water Diversion and Use Report that includes the required information regarding your diversion measurement device or method used to calculate the amount of water diverted, and the data collected by such a device or method within 30 days of receipt of this notice, OR**
- 2. If the corrective action requires procurement and installation of a measurement device, contact State Water Board staff within 30 days to relay your intent to install measurement device(s), the type of device proposed, the location that the device will be installed, and the schedule for installation of the device.**

Failure to correct this violation may subject you to enforcement actions and penalties as high as \$500 per day beginning from the first day of noncompliance.

Providing timely, accurate diversion information to the Board is critical for:

- Improved reporting of water use data helps all stakeholders identify and forecast watersheds of concern,
- Accurate diversion information helps protect the water rights priority system, community and industry needs, and the environment, and
- Timely water use data provides increased drought resilience for communities and organizations in times of water shortage.
