EXHIBIT

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Description of Projects

Applications 5169 and 6534 of Washoe County Water Conservation District cover the storage project of that District on Little Truckee River for irrigation and domestic purposes. The storage would be accomplished by what is known as Boca Dam, which is now in process of construction under a contract with the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation. Under Application 5169 the amount applied for is 40,000 acre feet and under Application 6534 an additional 10150 acre feet. The dam is situated in the set cut, section 21, T 18 N., R 18 E., M.D.B. & S., and the use would be made in Washoe County Water Conservation District in the State of Nevada, a district which is now operating extracting a net area of 50,000 acres.

Application 5170, also by Washoe County Water Conservation District, proposes an appropriation for power purposes which would involve direct diversion of a maximum of 500 second feet from Truckee River and a maximum of 200 second feet from Little Truckee River, but not to exceed 500 second feet total from the two sources by direct diversion, and the use of the irrigation storage as released from Boca Reservoir under Applications 5169 and 6534. The place of use is in the N½, Lot 10, Section 51, T 18 N., R 18 E., M.D.B. & S. The point of diversion on Truckee River is in the NW ¼ NE ¼, Section 32, T 18 N., R 17 E., M.D.B. & S., and the point of diversion on Little Truckee River is stated to be in the NW ¼ SE ¼, Section 16, T 18 N., R 17 E., M.D.B. & S., which is within Boca Reservoir at a point which would be flooded when the reservoir becomes operative, a situation

which arises from the fact that the location of Dona Dam has been changed since application 5170 was filed and the application has not yet been amended to show the new condition. There is apparently an understanding between Placer County Water Conservation District and Sierra Pacific Power Company to the effect that Application 5170 will be assigned by the former to the latter, but the assignment has not yet been made. There is neither a general understanding between these two parties and Truckee Carson Irrigation District, as interpreted at the hearing on October 4, 1950, that diversion and use under the application shall be subordinated to diversions and use for irrigation and domestic purposes under applications 5169 and 6684.

Application 6151 by Truckee Carson Irrigation District is to appropriate 15,000 acre feet per annum by storage from Donner and Gold Creeks, tributaries of Truckee River by storage in Donner Lake. Diversion is to be made from Donner Creek within the 3rd and Section 18, T 17 N, R 10 E, N.D.R. & H., and diversion from Gold Creek is to be made within the 3rd and Section 17 of the same township and range, the maximum rate of diversion from Gold Creek to storage in Donner Lake being 500 second feet. Use is proposed upon 37,500 acres within Truckee - Carson Irrigation District in Nevada for irrigation and domestic purposes.

Applications 9247 and 9257 of Sierra Pacific Power Company involve storage of 17,500 acre feet each in Independence Lake on the headwaters of Little Truckee River, the storage dam to be constructed within Lat 1 of Section 35, T 19 N, R 10 E, N.D.R. & H. Application 9247 is for municipal uses in the cities of Reno and Sparks, Nevada, and application 9257 is for power uses at the Fern, Fleisch, Verdi, Washoe, and Verdi power plants on Truckee River below the confluence of Truckee and Little Truckee Rivers.

Applications 5169, 5170, and 6534 were protested by U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and Truckee Carson Irrigation District. Application 6131 was protested by Orr Ditch and Water Company, Washoe County Water Conservation District and L. H. Taylor. Applications 9247 and 9287 were unprotected but being involved in the general situation were included for hearing with the other numbers because of the possibility that something might develop during the course of the hearing which would make it desirable to consider these applications also.

Compliance with Law and Rules of Division

Applications 5169, 5170, 6131, 6534, 9247, and 9287 were completed as required by the Water Commission Act and rules and regulations of the Division of Water Resources, and duly noticed. Applications 5169, 5170, 6131, and 6534 being protested and Applications 9247 and 9287 being involved in the same general situation all were included for hearing with due notice to known interested parties.

Washoe County Water Conservation District, Truckee - Carson Irrigation District, U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, and Sierra Pacific Power Company have reached an Agreement.

The so-called Truckee River Agreement executed July 1, 1955, by and between Washoe County Water Conservation District, Truckee - Carson Irrigation District, United States of America and Sierra Pacific Power Company adjusts the differences between these parties with respect to development proposed under the group of applications involved in these proceedings. The effect of this agreement is that insofar as the parties thereto are concerned;

1. Tuolumne County Water Conservation District may develop water applications 5169 and 5170 to develop Rock Reservoirs up to a capacity of not less than 40,000 acre feet.
2. Unleveered development proposed under Application 5170 must be surrendered to diversion and use under Application 5169 per ASRY.
3. Development under Application 5151 shall be held in abeyance pending completion of Rock Reservoir.
4. There is no objection to the storage proposed by Sierra Pacific Power Company under Applications 5047 and 5051.

The L. H. Taylor Protest is Withdrawn

L. H. Taylor protested Application 5151 at the time he held Applications 5169 and 5170. He subsequently assigned the two applications last named to Tuolumne County Water Conservation District. He was not represented at the hearing on October 4, 1958, and we may assume no longer has any objection to the approval of Application 5151.

The Ore Mine and Water Company Protest was Not Pressed

The protest of Ore Mine and Water Company was directed against Application 5151 only, was of a conditional nature, and has not been pressed. Protestant set up a claim of prior and existing rights to the waters of Donner and Gold Creeks, requested that Application 5151 be not approved until after there had been a determination of the rights of prior claimants, and that the application if approved be granted subject to the rights of protestant. This protestant was not represented at the hearing on October 4, 1958, and has failed to show any cause for failure to appear.

Since this protest was filed an agreement has been signed by the principal directors from Tuolumne River and its tributaries

which agreement looks to entry of a final decree in the case of the United States of America v. Orr Ditch and Water Company et al now pending before the District Court of the United States in and for the State of Nevada involving all claimants to water from this stream system. It appears to be the understanding among the signatories of this agreement that Application 6131 will be withdrawn if development is completed under Applications 5169 and 6534, and their desire that meantime action on Application 6131 be withheld.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

The differences between applicants and protestants involved in this proceeding appear to have been adjusted with the signing on July 1, 1955, of that certain agreement known as the Truckee River agreement. It is their common understanding and desire (1) that Applications 5169 and 6534 involving storage by Yachoe County Water Conservation District on Little Truckee River in Boca Reservoir be approved; (2) that Application 6170 be considered subordinate in right to both Application 5169 and Application 6534; (3) that action on Application 6131 be withheld until completion of development under Applications 5169 and 6534 is assured at which time it will probably be withdrawn, and if approved that it be considered subordinate in right to Application 6534; (4) that Applications 9247 and 9248 be approved.

Applications 5169, 6534, 9247, and 9248 are for useful and beneficial purposes and there appears now no obstacle to their approval. Application 6170 however is incomplete and it appears should

now either be completed or withdrawn.

Order

Applications 5169, 5170, 5151, and 6534 having been protested, Applications 9247 and 9267 being involved by relation thereto, a hearing upon protests having been held after due notice to the parties in interest, and the Division being now fully advised in the premises

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Applications 5169, 6534, 9247, and 9267 be approved and that permits be issued to the applicants subject to such of the usual terms and conditions as may be appropriate, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that action on Applications 5170 and 5151 be withheld until further order is entered.
